Ingredients

Each ingredient as named in accordance with the names and definitions adopted by the Association of American Feed Control Officials.

Mixing Directions

Thoroughly mix the Type B medicated feed into the appropriate amount of non-medicated feed to manufacture Type C medicated feed that contains 50 to 117 g/ton chlortetracycline and 7.14 to 40 g/ton monensin. No additional improvement in feed efficiency has been shown from feeding monensin at levels greater than 30 g/ton (360 mg monensin per head per day).
